

Artist Statement

Neighbours is inspired by the remote place in Finland where I have my family roots. The area is flat and rural, and has seen many previous inhabitants be drawn towards larger cities and towns, thus leaving their old family homes to stand empty. Upon visiting this area I have always been struck by the omnipresence of nature and the vastness of uninhabited space, and by looking at failed attempts to settle, these images aim to explore the tension between nature and inhabitation. Their flat perspective doesn't allow for easy access of the depicted space, and by denying exploration, these images are also symbolic of my own relationship to my Finnish roots as well as attempting to capture that particular kind of spatial and temporal stasis specific to some remote areas. Rather than being a pure photographic portrayal of an actual space these images show a perceived and manipulated space, and sit somewhere on the border between reality and fiction.

Biography

Martina Lindqvist (born Finland 1981) studied Photography at Hull College followed by Photographic Arts at The University of Westminster, London, UK. Her inspiration is drawn from childhood memories of places where she grew up and visited as a child in Finland. Lindqvist's unsettlingly still landscapes have the quality of an illusion, hovering somewhere between reality and the imagination. Lindqvist has exhibited in the UK, Europe and India, she was the winner of Flash Forward: Emerging Photographers Award in 2010, The Jerwood Photography Awards in 2008 and was shortlisted for the IPG Terry O'Neill Award in 2008.
